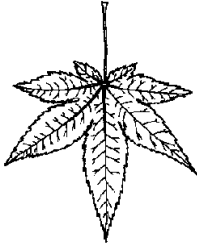


ArborTags



Many varieties of the Japanese Maple exist, but the leaf is still distinctive with 5-9 pointed lobes which are usually cut deeply toward the center. The leaves grow opposite on long stalks, and are coarsely serrated.

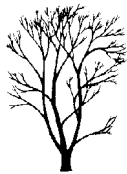
Cutleaf Maple

There are many varieties of the Japanese Maple, some dwarfs growing no more than 2 feet, other standard varieties reaching 10--25 feet. The bark is smooth, grey-brown and often shows stress marks on the trunk and near the base of limbs.
