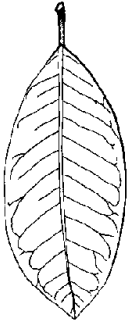


# ArborTags

True to its latin name the flowers, like water lilies, have very large white blossoms with 6 or more petals which perfume the air in the early summer. The fruit is a large vertical cone of clustered seeds which ripen in the autumn.
