


# ArborTags



These are broad leaves with 5 lobes not cut very deeply toward the stem. Like a sugar maple leaf except its underside is not whitish but glossy green, the lobes at the base of the leaf are broader, and the stem is longer.

Bright yellow blossoms distinguish this tree in the springtime.

The key of the Norway maple is like a coat hanger. It has a very flat body and is the most open or wide-spread of all. Hanging on long stalks these light brown clusters mature in late summer.

This maple can grow to 100 feet with a full dome shaped canopy. It is often planted as an effective shade tree, allowing little light for any undergrowth. The bark is dark gray and tightly, or narrowly, furrowed.
