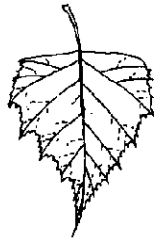


ArborTags



Like the Gray Birch, the leaf is doubly saw-toothed giving it a very coarse edge. Nearly triangular in shape it has a pointed tip. It is shiny dark green on top and much paler beneath.

Like the Paper Birch the flowers are up to 4 inches long, thin catkins, at the tip of the twigs. The catkin-like cones are roughly an inch long, brown with short stems.

European White Birch

The European White Birch, or European Weeping Birch is a short lived but beautiful specimen tree with one of the whitest of the Birch barks. It can be distinguished from the Gray Birch by the drooping branches and the horizontally peeling bark. Its leaf is narrower and longer pointed than the Paper Birch.
